

The Theme of 2018 International Conference

Neuroscience and Kids, Intergenerational Parenting, and Healthy Aging

Chu Chu Wu, Ph.D.

The Chinese-American Academic and Professional Association in Southeastern United States (CAPASUS) was established on June 25, 1977 in Atlanta, Georgia. CAPASUS is a "not for profit" organization. The objectives of CAPASUS are: 1) to provide opportunities for all members to exchange their academic, cultural, social, professional, and business knowledge and experiences; and 2) to make academic, cultural, social, professional, and business contributions to the societies of the United States and the Republic of China. The CAPASUS holds its annual meetings in Atlanta, GA or other southeastern US cities.

In the past 40 years, CAPASUS annual conference themes have centered on Science, Technology, Business, and Engineering. It has created opportunities to bring the Chinese American Communities in the Southeastern region to network and exchange knowledge in the diverse fields. The presentations at the annual conferences were constantly well received and highly regarded by the Chinese-American community professionals

Rationale

Different from the past conferences' focuses on science, engineering and technology, the 2018 CAPASUS 42nd annual meeting and international conference will focus on social science featuring neuroscience in learning and aging, intergenerational and bicultural parenting perspectives, and evidence-based healthy aging. With the advancement of technology (internet of things), business, and industrial development, the distance of the world has become closer yet relationships among people seem to become more distant than ever. The family size is getting smaller than it used to be, while the number of older persons in the world has increased statistically in recent years. The average number of children per household has drastically decreased from 3 to 1. According to United Nations, in 2000 there were 71 million people aged 80 or over worldwide. Projections indicated by United Nations that by 2050 there will be 434 million of the "oldest-old" (aged 80 or over) people. Children are the hope of our future and the elderly are the preservers of cultural wisdom. How to sustain the quality of early childhood education and aging caregiving has become an important issue for us to study and discuss!

Additionally, the objectives of the 2017 International Day of Families, featured by the United Nations, focused on raising awareness of "the role of families" and promot-

ing family-oriented policies regarding "life-long education for the young and youth" and "overall well-being of family members."

The United Nations has emphasized the importance of caregivers in families; for example, parents, grandparents and siblings. The International Day of Families also focused on good practices for work-family balance to assist parents in their educational and caregiving roles. The Day of Families also stressed the importance of "appreciation of cultural diversity, and of culture's contribution to sustainable development." Recently the World Health Organization's World Health and Ageing Report (2017) emphasized "functional ability" as an important outcome for aging populations, highlighting the concept of raising intrinsic capacity throughout the life course. The complementary perspective is the prevention of frailty, which involves physical, cognitive, social and psychological dimensions. Therefore, services for older people should encompass medical as well as social components.

This year I have the honor to serve as the president of the Chinese-American Academic and Professional Association in Southeastern United States (CAPASUS). I have been passionate about organizing a conference that is related to Early Childhood Education, early reading, and parenting. Therefore, I am coordinating the conference with the scholars from Georgia State University, Syracuse University, Georgia Southwestern State University, Gordon State College, Albert Einstein College of Medicine, and top-notch scholars from Taiwan. The conference will feature a theme of cognitive neuroscience findings that support aspects of promoting reading and language development in the early years and promoting brain-based healthy aging. The forum will also discuss the perspectives and aspirations of intergenerational and bicultural parenting in the Chinese immigrant families to reduce generational differences. And last but not least, incorporating mindfulness and art into daily practices to balance work and family is an integral part of building healthy families in modern society. The conference will feature three sub-topical tracks: 1) Neuroscience and Kids and Healthy Aging; 2) Intergenerational Parenting; 3) The Balance of Body and Mind.

Objectives

The objectives of this conference are as follows:

- 1. To share evidence-based research in cognition, child development and aging;
- 2. To promote and facilitate intellectual interaction and scientific collaboration between scientific communities in the U.S. and Taiwan;
- 3. To address current needs in the development of early childhood education and aging caregiving in Taiwan;
- 4. To raise awareness of cultural identity and cultural competence among the

- first generation Chinese Americans and promote effective communications between generations;
- 5. To promote awareness of the role of families and the importance of caregivers in the families in the U.S. and Taiwan.

Expectable Benefit

The expectable benefit of conference are as follows:

- 1. To foster and initiate research collaborations between Taiwan and United States Scholars on "cognitive neuroscience, early childhood education, cross-cultural parenting studies and gerontology";
- 2. To provide up-to-date research findings on brain research in relation to early reading difficulties in young children and how to parent children developmentally appropriately and preventive treatment for aging adults;
- 3. To provide a supportive learning community for early career scholars to present their research, exchange academic and professional knowledge, and socially network with the professionals within their fields;
- 4. To create a platform for multi-generational professionals to communicate, to exchange, and share their experiences and expertise between the schools and the Asian community. For example, the intergenerational parenting panel discussion will provide the first- and second- generation Chinese American parents with insights on how to communicate better with their next generation raised in a bicultural environment. Another example of intergenerational communication is through CAPASUS's mentoring program, where senior scholars can pass down their valuable experiences and advice to early career scholars.

美東南區中華學人協會第四十二屆年會暨國際研討會 主題介紹:大腦科學與兒童、跨世代教養、和健康老齡化

美東南區中華學人協會(CAPASUS)於1977年6月25日在美國喬治亞州亞特蘭大成 立。 CAPASUS是一個『不以營利為目的』的組織。CAPASUS的目標是:1) 為所有成 員提供交流其學術、文化、社會、專業和商業知識及經驗的機會: 2) 為學術、文 化、社會、專業和商業貢獻於美國和中華民國社會。CAPASUS每年會在喬治亞州亞 特蘭大或美國其他東南部城市舉行年會。

在過去的40年中,CAPASUS年會的主題圍繞著科學、技術、商業和工程。它為 美東南華裔社區在不同領域的人士提供了交流知識的機會。年會上的發表常常受到 華人社區高度的評價。

緣由

有別於過去以關注理工、科學與高科技為重點的年會,今年CAPASUS第42屆年 會暨國際研討會將側重於社會科學的人文議題:其中包括閱讀和兒童發展相關的認 知神經科學、健康老齡化的循證研究、 跨世代和雙文化教養觀點、 以及身心平衡 的現代生活。

隨著科技(物聯網),商業和工業發展的進步,世界的距離越來越近,但人 與人之間的關係似乎比以前更加遙遠。近幾年來,世界老年人口數量增加,家庭 規模逐漸縮小。每個家庭的平均孩子數量從3個大幅減少到1個。根據聯合國的統 計,2000年全世界有七千萬超過八十歲的老人。聯合國預測,到2050年,『最老的 人』(80歲以上)人口將達到四億三千萬人口。孩子是我們未來的希望,老年人是 文化智慧的保存者。如何保持幼兒教育和老年照護的良好品質已成為我們學習和探 討的重要課題!

此外,聯合國在2017年發起國際家庭日,其活動的目標著眼於提高『家人角色』的認知,推展以家庭為主導的政策,如『青少年的終身教育』,以及『家庭成員的整體幸福』為前提。聯合國強調照護者在家庭中的重要性;例如父母、祖父母或兄弟姐妹。國際家庭日還特別關注於工作與家庭達到平衡的良好做法,以協助家長兼顧教育者和照顧者的角色。家庭日還強調『欣賞文化多樣性和文化對永續發展的貢獻』的重要性。(參見https://www.un.org/development/desa/family/international-day-of-家庭/idf2017.html)

最近,世界衛生組織的『世界健康與老齡化報告』(2017)強調,操作能力對 老人的重要性,也特別強調如何在整體生命過程中持續提高內在能力的重要概念。 另一個相輔相成的觀點是預防身體弱化,包括了體力、認知、社交和心理方面的虚 弱。因此,對老年人的服務應該在醫療和社會部分雙管齊下。

今年,我很榮幸地當上美東南區中華學人協會的會長。我的專業興趣在於早期 閱讀和親子教養。我一直想辦一場跟早期閱讀與親子教養的有關的座談會。因此, 今年有幸能透過學人協會的學術研討會名義,特別邀請到華洋知名的學者,例如: 雪城大學家庭與兒童發展學系的榮譽教授與親子教養專家, Dr. Alice S. Honig; 來自台灣中央大學學習與教學研究所長暨前國家教育學院院長與兒童閱讀專家,柯 華葳博士;喬治亞大學老人學院所長, Dr. Elisabeth Burgess;喬治亞州立大學 護理系副院長,Dr. Susan Kellev;艾伯特愛因斯坦醫學院的臨床心理學家,Dr. Teresa Hsu-Walklet;來自台灣國立陽明大學衛生福利研究所的吳肖琪博士;還有 來自喬治亞州內的各專業學者來共襄盛舉這場大腦科學和兒童、跨世代教養、健康 老齡化的國際研討會。這場國際議題將聚焦於推動大腦認知科學的語言學習與教養 相關主題,以及促進腦部健康老齡化方面的循証研究與運用。論增也將討論美籍 華人在跨世代和雙文化養育的觀點與願望,以減少世代之間的意見分歧。同時, 將心感靜坐和藝術融入日常實踐中以平衡工作和家庭,身心平衡是現代社會健康 家庭的一個重要部分。會議將以下三個主題為中心:1) 大腦科學與兒童與健康老 齡化;2) 跨世代教養觀;3) 身與心的平衡。完整的演講者名單請見年會議程第9 頁。

研討會的目的

- 1. 分享發表與認知科學、兒童發展和老化相關的循證研究;
- 2. 促進和推動美國和台灣科學界之間的智力交流和科學合作;
- 3. 呼應當前台灣幼兒教育和老齡照顧發展相關議題的需要;
- 4. 提高第一代華裔美國人對「文化認同」和「文化能力」的認識,促進世代之間的有效溝通;
- 提高對家庭角色的認識和照顧者在美國和台灣家庭中的重要性。

研討會的預期成果

- 開展台灣和美國學者在『認知神經科學』、幼兒教育、跨文化親子學習和 老年學 。方面的研究和合作;
- 2. 提供最新的大腦科學研究對兒童早期閱讀困難,和開發適宜的預防性防老 齡治療方面的知識;
- 3. 為剛出道的新學者提供一個支持的學習社團,讓他們有機會展示他們的研 究成果、交流學術和專業知識,並與他們所在領域的專業人士進行交流;
- 4. 今年的會議透過學術單位和亞城華人社團合作,為老、中、青三代建立了 溝通,交流和分享經驗和專業知識的平台。例如,跨世代教養小組討論為 第一代和第二代美籍華人父母提供有關如何更好地與他們在雙文化環境中 培養的下一代溝通的見解。另一個跨世代溝通的例子,就是學人協會的輔 導計劃,來自各州的資深學者可以透過輔導小組的討論,傳遞寶貴的經 驗,並給剛出社會的學者良好的建議。

Alice Sterling Honig, Ph.D.

Professor Emerita Syracuse University

ABSTRACT

We will examine what Child Development Researches have shown are essentials for a child's well-being in order for a child to grow up as an enthusiastic, self-actualized, and confident learner with determination to work hard, as well as growing up with self-control, compassion, empathy and respect for others, with the ability to form intimate loving friendships, as well as the ability to problem solve wisely and positively when faced with life challenges. We will also consider Chinese Cultural precepts that impact on aspects



of a child's growth and development. Awareness of how these mesh can help Chinese families optimize grandparent and parent interactions with children.

BIOGRAPHY

For over 45 years, in addition to the many courses she created and taught (including: "Language and Cognition" and "Prosocial and Moral development") at Syracuse University, Dr. Honig has authored or edited more than 2 dozen books and more than 620 articles and chapters. Among her books are: "Playtime learning games for young children" (SU Press); "Talking with your baby: family as the first school" (with H. Brophy) (SU Press); "Risk factors in infancy" (Gordon & Breach Press); "Behavior guidance for infants and toddlers" (SECA Press); "Secure relationships: nurturing infant/toddler attachment in childcare setting" (NAEYC Publications); and "Little kids, big worries: stress-busting tips for early childhood classrooms" (Brookes Publishers). Her most recent books are: "The best for babies: expert advice for assessing infant/toddler programs" (Gryphon House Press), and "Experiencing nature with young children: awakening delight, curiosity, and a sense of stewardship" (NAEYC). She has written and narrated a video "Nurturing young children's language power" (Davidson Films).

Dr. Honig presents training sessions and delivers keynote addresses to promote high quality childcare all over the United States and in several other countries, including South Korea, Singapore, France, China, and Australia and for United States Army Childcare Centers in Germany. For over a decade, Dr. Honig (with a lawyer as co-leader) conducted workshops for The Onondaga County Mental Health Association for parents with divorce and child custody issues. As

a licensed New York state psychologist, she carries out assessments of infants, preschoolers and school-age child cognitive and emotional development as well as helping families with problems.

For over 37 years, Dr. Honig served annually at Syracuse University as the Director of the National Quality Infant/Toddler Care-giving Workshop held in the spring. She contributed regularly as a columnist for Scholastic Parent and Child and Scholastic Early Education Today as well as for the Scholastic Website for Parents. Dr. Honig for over 35 years has been the North American Editor for the British journal Early Child Development and Care. She serves on the Editorial Board of the National Head Start NHSA Dialog Journal and of the journal PsycCritiques. She has also served on the editorial board of Child Development, the official journal of the Society for Research in Child Development.

In 1984 Dr. Honig was awarded the highest Syracuse University academic award bestowed annually: The Chancellor's Citation for Academic Excellence. In 2011, Dr. Honig was awarded the annual CEACE (Concerned Educators Allied for a Safe Environment) award at the Annual NAEYC meeting. In 2013, Dr. Honig was honored by being asked to present a plaque in her name to an outstanding Chinese pediatrician as well as to train childcare providers in Beijing to work with parents and young children. In 2014, Dr. Bettye Caldwell designated and endowed the Alice Sterling Honig scholarship award for CFS students.

從眼球移動研究的觀點來看中文閱讀 Reading Chinese: A View from Eye Movement Studies

ABSTRACT

Chinese words are more difficult to define than words in alphabet texts. For Chinese words can be comprised of one or more characters. Words can also be individual characters with independent meanings. Nevertheless, the majority is made up of two (65% or so) or more characters. Moreover, each spoken syllable of lexical tone is represented by about eight different characters on average (homophone). In addition, one cannot tell the boundary of a word in printed



Chinese. It is essential that Chinese readers find a way to disambiguate a word by considering it in context. In this report, we will present developmental eye movement study (grade 2 to 6) to show a PVL (preferred viewing location) of reading Chinese words. Data of college students' reading familiar and unfamiliar physics texts will also be presented. It is interesting to observe readers' first fixation durations on target words, whether physics terminology or common words were not significantly different. Yet, different integrating process patterns appear among students with distinct level of physics background knowledge. In sum, while reading Chinese, genre, word frequency and familiarity effect are marked. Since readers read for meaning, the author argues that Chinese word is the reading unit of Chinese.

BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Hwawei Ko is Professor at National Tsing Hua University and National Central University in Taiwan. Her research interest is on reading Chinese. For many years, she and her lab members have used eye trackers to study eye movements while reading Chinese, either narratives or informational texts. Eye movement evidence clearly shows that reading Chinese characters fluently does not imply comprehension of the Chinese words. Dr. Ko also serves as the NRC for Progress in International Reading Literacy Study (PIRLS) since 2004 in Taiwan. Many reading policy suggestions for Ministry of Education (MOE) and school teachers have derived from participating PIRLS. In practice, Ko mobilizes

college colleague and elementary school teachers to focus on reading literacy and reading strategies. A couple of teaching reading strategies manuals have been published under her guidance in Taiwan. Professor Ko also hosts a radio program (Bravo radio, 91.3, Taiwan) every Saturday morning to share books with audience.

ABSTRACT

The whole brain child is a revolutionary approach to child rearing that is based on brain science and the concept of neuroplasticity. Neuroplasticity is the concept that the brain can be wired and rewired by our experience. The whole brain child approach focuses on strategies that parents and educators can utilize to help integrate the brain so that it can work in balanced and coordinated ways as a whole instead of distinct parts. By integrating the brain, parents and educators provide experiences that foster healthy brain development. The whole brain child approach leads to healthier, happier children and more compassionate, effective parenting.

BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Qi Zhou received her Ph.D. in Psychology, specialized in School Psychology. During her internship in Jefferson Parish public school system, LA, while working with students with emotional disorders, she took an interest in the field of emotional intelligence. Dr. Zhou went on to teach psychology courses at college level, and she expanded her interest into positive psychology – a scientific study of happiness and human strength. During her study of positive psychology, Dr. Zhou discovered meditation and has been practicing it daily for years. She proposed that meditation,



as a way to improve emotional wellbeing and overall happiness, should be a mental habit that everyone needs to build and practice.

As a mother of two, Dr. Zhou's another area of interest is parenting. Dr. Zhou believes that parenting should cultivate good physical, mental, moral, and

spiritual habits in the child, nurture their emotional wellbeing, and grow their emotional intelligence. Dr. Zhou is passionate about living green and staying connected to nature. She resides in south Atlanta with her husband and two children on their hobby farm.

Dr. Houbin Fang is an Associate Professor of Mathematics Education in the Department of Mathematics at Columbus State University of Columbus, GA. Dr. Fang has more than ten years' teaching experiences in K12 and higher education combined. He has four years' teaching experience as a middle school math teacher in two international private schools in China. In the United States, Dr. Fang has taught mathematics courses to pre-service elementary and middle school teachers for seven years. In addition, he has been leading teachers' STEM training programs funded by the Educa-

tional Department of Mississippi and the Educational Department of Georgia, respectively, for five years.

Dr. Fang's interest in the education of preschool-aged children stemmed from his teaching mathematics courses to Early Childhood majors. He noticed that emotional and psychological factors, instead of intellectual capacities, limited pre-service teachers' mathematics abilities. When Dr. Fang discovered that this phenomenon can be generalized to virtually all aspects in life, he deeply realized the importance of cultivating healthy emotional development in young children.

台灣的長期護理 Long-Term Care in Taiwan

ABSTRACT

In 2009, the percentage of Taiwan's population aged above 65 was 10.6%, and it is projected to reach 14.7% and 22.5% in 2018 and 2028 respectively. As our society ages, naturally, the demands for long-term care will also undergo rapid growth. Currently the government of Taiwan is already engaged in a "Ten-Year Plan for Promoting Our Long-term Care System." This plan is intended to reduce family burdens of caring for people who require long-term care. Under the "Ten-year Plan for Promoting Our Long-term Care

System," as people still need to pay 30% of the cost for long-term care, and subsidy is only granted to low-income people who are also severely disabled to stay in long-term care institutions, long-term care services will still be very costly for people and their families. Hence, it is urgent to establish a risk-sharing social insurance system in order to solve these financial problems. The Executive Yuan has been planning the long-term care insurance since December of 2008.

BIOGRAPHY

Professor Shiao-Chi Wu received her Ph.D. from National Taiwan University (1991). She has been the president of Long Term Care Association (2008-2014) and Taiwan Public Health Association (2015-2017). She works in Institute of Health and Welfare Policy, National Yang-Ming University over 30 years. Her major research interest is evidence-based health policy, especially focus on medical care, National health insurance, and long term care. She had been invited by Minister of Health and Welfare as a member in National Health Insurance Committee to negotiate (deal with) premium, medical coverage, and budget of National Health Insurance in Taiwan. In 1992, she got a Visiting Scholar Grant from National Science Council to visit Australia to learn Home and Community Care Program (aged care in community). In 2001, she advocated (initiated) the Taiwan Long Term Care Service Act to provide a legal framework for the integration of various types of long-term care services. She was invited by government to implement National Long Term Care Insurance (2009-2016). She is also actively involved in dealing with setting up aged friendly city and implementing programs for active aging in Taiwan.

這裡沒有好男人: 養老院再找老伴的情況 There's No Nice Men Here: The Context of Repartnership in Assisted Living

Elisabeth Burgess, Ph.D.

Director and Professor of Gerontology Institute Georgia State University

ABSTRACT

Re-entering the dating marketplace after the death of a spouse is challenging for both men and women because of uncertainty about how to negotiate the changing landscape of dating and intimacy. A complicating factor for understanding issues of partnership, sex, and intimacy for older adults is the use of long-term care. Using a feminist gerontological perspective and guided by a grounded theory perspective, we examine how the context of Assisted Living (AL) shapes the opportunities and experiences of residents



seeking to experiment with dating, cross-sex companionship, and repartnering in six AL facilities. We found individuals express desires which are further mediated by social patterns and interactions with other residents and staff members. The ability for AL residents' to engage in dating, intimacy, and repartnering in the AL setting was controlled by individual and community factors. Although sexuality and intimacy are framed as intensely personal decisions, we found that the context of assisted living shaped residents' sexual decision making. What is unique to AL is how desire and lack of desire are expressed, the environment in which relationships take place, and the individual and institutional barriers and opportunities that influence the ability to date and/or repartner. This research expands previous studies of sexuality and older adults by examining not only opportunity structure for repartnering but also explaining how the gendered social climate of AL influences individual behavior.

BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Elisabeth O. Burgess is Director of the Gerontology Institute at Georgia State University, where she is a Professor of Gerontology and Sociology. Dr. Burgess is a Social Gerontologist whose work focuses on relationships over the life course, including issues of sexuality and intimacy for older adults, aging families and intergenerational relationships. In addition, her research examines long-term care and perceptions of aging, stereotypes, and ageism. Dr. Burgess regularly collaborates with colleagues studying aging across a wide array of disciplines including Nursing, Physical Therapy, Communication, and Social Work. Her research has been published in a wide variety of Gerontology, Health, and Social Science journals including Journal of Gerontology: Social Sciences, The

Gerontologist, Qualitative Health Research and Journal of Applied Gerontology. Dr, Burgess is co-editor of "Sex matters: the sexuality and society reader" (Fifth Edition to be released in late 2018). In collaboration with Dr. Morgan, also at the Gerontology Institute, and Culture Change Network of Georgia, Dr. Burgess is working on a new three-year project "Building Resources for Delivering Person-Centered Care in Georgia Nursing Homes" funded by Centers for Medicate and Medicaid Services and Georgia State Survey Agency. Dr. Burgess is also a Fellow of the Gerontological Society of America.



ABSTRACT

The most common type of dementia is Alzheimer's disease. It is the 5th leading cause of death among older adults. One in ten older Americans has Alzheimer's disease. In 2017, an estimated 5.3 million Americans aged 65 years or older had Alzheimer's disease. This number is projected to rise to 14 million people by 2050 (Alzheimer's Association, 2017; CDC, 2017). The objectives of this presentation are to review the empirical intervention studies in improving cognitive functions and preventing Alzheimer's disease, and provide intervention recommendations for older adults.



BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Mei Lan Chen received her master's degree in nursing from Taipei Medical University with a focus on exercise prescription & exercise training in patients with chronic diseases, and cardiac rehabilitation. Dr. Chen earned her Ph.D. degree from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro in May 2016. Currently, Dr. Chen's primary area of research focuses on the development of theory-based physical activity programs and lifestyle interventions to promote healthy aging and reduce health disparities in older adults.

祖父母撫養的孩子: 全球視野 Children Raised by Grandparents: A Global Perspective

Susan J. Kelley, Ph.D.

Professor and Associate Dean for Nursing Byrdine F. Lewis College of Nursing & Health Professions Georgia State University

ABSTRACT

Across the globe, children are raised by grandparents because of a variety of reasons including child maltreatment and adverse childhood experiences, as well as labor migration. While the antecedents to children being raised by grandparents may vary by global region, many of these grandchildren and grandparent caregivers are at increased risk for negative health and social outcomes. Research findings related to this phenomenon in China and the United States will be compared. This presentation will also



address the challenges of grandparents raising grandchildren, as well as strategies for improving the outcomes for grandparent-headed families. Project Healthy Grandparents, a program designed to enhance the well-being of grandparent-headed families in Atlanta, Georgia will be discussed.

BIOGRAPHY

Susan J. Kelley, Ph.D. is the Chief Academic Officer and Professor at the School of Nursing at Georgia State University in Atlanta. From 1999 to 2011, she served as the Dean of the College of Health and Human Sciences at Georgia State University. Dr. Kelley received her Ph.D. in Developmental Psychology from Boston College, as well as her B.S. and M.S. in Nursing from Boston University. Dr. Kelley's previous professional experience includes serving as Chairperson and Professor, Department of Maternal-Child Health Nursing at Boston College School of Nursing; Director of Nursing Education, Massachusetts Emergency Medical Services; and pediatric nurse at Columbia Presbyterian Hospital and Boston City Hospital.

Dr. Kelley has specialized in the field of child abuse since 1980 and has published more than 80 journal articles and book chapters on various aspects of child abuse. She serves on the editorial boards of the *Journal of Child Sexual Abuse; Trauma, Violence and Abuse: A Review Journal;* and *GrandFamilies: The Contemporary Journal of Research, Practice, and Policy.* She has been a Fellow in the American Academy of Nursing since 1990 and is a member of numerous child abuse and nursing professional societies. Dr. Kelley serves on the national boards of Prevent Child Abuse America and the Academy of Violence and Abuse, as well on the board of Mercy Care in Atlanta.

Dr. Kelley is the founder and director of Project Healthy Grandparents, a community-based research and service program that provides comprehensive services to families in which grandparents are raising grandchildren in parentabsent homes or the vast majority of children have been abused, neglected, and abandoned by their birth parents.

ABSTRACT

This presentation will explore several aspects of mental health and social functioning in teenagers, with a goal of giving parents and professionals who work with teenagers some practical suggestions for successful interactions. Topics will include brain development and its ties to emotional reactions, signs of depression, the effects of social media on teenagers' mental health and self-esteem, and strategies for minimizing conflict with teenagers.



BIOGRAPHY

Ellen Cotter has a B.A. in Psychology from the University of Virginia and a M.A. and Ph.D. in Developmental Psychology from the University of Alabama at Birmingham. She is a Professor of Psychology in the Department of Psychology and Sociology at Georgia Southwestern State University. She regularly teaches courses on topics related to lifespan development, caregiving, and psychological aspects of language. Her research interests include the scholarship of teaching and learning, critical thinking, and caregiving.

ABSTRACT

We are currently experiencing a huge cultural "gap," or the lack of mutual understanding of different cultures, generations, and/or other social divides, between two peoples, and this gap is particularly relevant to disagreements about parenting first- and second-generation children. In fact, "mommy shaming" and community/societal judgments about child rearing have shamed parents of both younger and older generations for years. However, these disagreements assume that parenting style/a child's



environment ("nurture") is more important than the impact of genetics ("nature") on the child. While Western researchers have demonstrated that one particular style of parenting results in raising the most successful child, there is arguably no one "right" way to parent, and new research suggests that "nature" still plays a big role, and children may still succeed—even unexpectedly.

BIOGRAPHY

Teresa Hsu-Walklet, Ph.D., is a Supervising Psychologist with Montefiore Medical Group's Pediatric Behavioral Health Integration Program (Pediatric BHIP) and a Clinical Instructor of Pediatrics at Albert Einstein College of Medicine in the Bronx, New York. The Pediatric BHIP is the largest integrated behavioral health network of its kind, integrating universal mental health screening, assessment, treatment, consultation, and referrals in all of Montefiore's 22 pediatric primary care sites. The Pediatric BHIP team recently won the 2018 Healthcare Delivery Award from the Academic Pediatrics Association.

Dr. Hsu-Walklet joined Montefiore and Einstein in 2014 and has worked closely with Rahil Briggs, Psy.D., the director of Pediatric BHIP and the director of national Zero to Three, in the initial implementation of Pediatric BHIP at Montefiore's Family Care Center (FCC). She leads the Pediatric BHIP team at FCC, teaches residents and medical students, co-facilitates collaborative office rounds, supervises psychologists at all levels of training, and provides direct clinical care. Dr. Hsu-Walklet's research interests focus on integrating behavioral health in primary care and on a multi-level, systemic understanding of mental health and emotional adjustment in children and adolescents.

Dr. Hsu-Walklet completed her undergraduate work at Northwestern University, where she graduated cum laude and double majored in Psychology and Piano Performance, and her doctoral work at The George Washington University.

移民家庭的文化視角 Cultural Perspectives of Immigrant Families

Alice Stanley, Ed.D.

Program Director of Georgia Parent Infant Network for Educational Services (Georgia PINES) Georgia Department of Education

ABSTRACT

Issues of cultural identity and conflict occur with increased frequency among immigrants and their families. The second generation of youth from immigrant families often face challenges and conflicts. This presentation will examine the major differences between Western and Eastern cultures, using the framework of cultural comparison and perspective and different cultural dynamics within multigenerational immigrant families. The presenter will challenge the audience with questions and insights that



apply to their own individual situations. Increasing our understanding of this issue can open the door for further dialogue and study, so the social and mental well-being of immigrant families can be preserved and children of immigrant parents can benefit from the best of the cultures they encounter.

BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Alice Stanley brings with her tremendous experience and expertise in working with families as the Director of Georgia Parent Infant Network for Educational Services, a Department of Education agency serving over 525 families with 200+ staff/contractors, for the last 10 years. Prior to that, Dr. Stanley was a Special Education Coordinator for Clayton County Public Schools. In addition, she has 23 years of teaching experiences working with children from preschool to high school and other experiences as Chinese language teacher, Parent Advisor for Georgia PINES, and Practicum Supervisor for Georgia State University. She has presented to the Georgia Association of Education of Young Children Conference, the Foreign Language Association of Georgia Conference, the Institute Designed for Educating All Students (IDEAS) Conference, and the Georgia Educational Technology Conference. She has taught numerous workshops and staff development courses on Special Education and worked with culturally diverse families. Her teaching certificates include the following areas: National Board Certified Teacher as Early Childhood Through Young Adulthood/Exceptional Needs Specialist, Georgia L-7 in Director of Special Education, and Special Education General Curriculum. Her educational background includes: B.S. in Foreign Language and Literature (National Taiwan University), M.Ed. and Ed.S. in Education of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (Georgia State University), and Ed.D. in Child, Youth, and Families Studies (Nova Southeastern University in Florida).

文學與文化交流: 閱讀和做一個出生在美國的華人 Literary and Cultural Transaction: Reading and Being American Born Chinese

Xiaodi Zhou, Ph.D.

Assistant Professor of Literacy Education School of Education Georgia Southwestern State University

ABSTRACT

This session analyzes the literary and cultural transactions of text with the reader. In this autoethnographic study (Chang, 2008), I, an adult Chinese American male who has lived in the U.S. for most of his life, responds to the graphic novel American Born Chinese by Gene Luen Yang. Functioning from Rosenblatt's (1982) theory of literary transaction and Galda and Beach's (2001) cultural response to literature, I take a critical look at this text from a cultural insider's perspective. There are points when my experiences and the



protagonist's coincide, and others where we veer. Identification with this book, the level of transaction may be due to the level of acculturation into the dominant mainstream US society. The perspective of this text is from a cultural insider's perspective of the Chinese American experience, and I found myself identifying much with the protagonist. In this sense, the model minority identity is portrayed in such a way that the Chinese American individual sees him or herself as White, yearning to be White, and feeling shame towards his or her Chinese ancestry. My recent shame towards my attitude towards my heritage culture was assuaged by the presentation of this voice, this person who shares my own cultural attitudes and helped me identify more closely with my heritage.

BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Xiaodi Zhou is an Assistant Professor of Literacy Education at GSW. He received his bachelors in psychology (cum laude) and masters and specialist in counselor education from the University of Florida. He recently graduated with his Ph.D. from the University of Georgia in Athens before coming to Georgia Southwestern State. Before beginning his doctoral studies, he taught English in China at Nanjing University, where he spent three years rediscovering the culture and language he left when he was seven. Xiaodi grew up on the East Coast of the US, having lived in New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Maryland, Florida, and Georgia. He speaks three languages and has visited many countries and cultures throughout the world.

He has published in both national and international journals, as well as presented at national and international conferences, about theories of transnationalism and cultural and linguistic hybridity.

Targeting Co-Inhibitory Molecules Improves Sepsis Mortality in Pre-Existing Malignancy Animals

ABSTRACT

Cancer patients have a ten-fold greater risk of developing sepsis and three-fold higher sepsis mortality compared to the general population. However, specific treatment has yet been developed to pre-existing malignancy septic patients. Recently, blocking co-inhibitory signals has been FDA-approved for several types of cancer immunotherapy. Interestingly, targeting the co-inhibitory signals during sepsis are also the promising therapies for general septic patients. Therefore, in this study, we utilized animal models to test the efficacy of blocking co-inhibiting therapy on pre-existing malignancy septic animals. Animals were implanted with lung cancer cells line (LLC) for three weeks and then sepsis was induced by cecal ligation and puncture (CLP) surgery. The efficacies of blocking co-inhibitory signaling, by using anti-PD1 or anti-2B4 monoclonal antibodies, were evaluated on pre-existing malignancy septic animals. Sepsis survival and surface markers of immune cells were determined. Both anti-PD1 and anti-2B4 blockade have been shown to improve sepsis survival in normal sepsis animal model previously. However, in pre-existing malignancy sepsis model, anti-PD1 therapy didn't increase the sepsis survival of cancer animals. Surprisingly, anti-2B4 blockade significantly decreased the sepsis mortality in 7 days of cancer animals. 2B4 is a novel coinhibitory molecule expressed mainly on memory T cells. To further dissect the mechanism, surface markers on T cells are analyzed after anti-2B4 monoclonal antibody treatment. We found that T cells expressed increased activation markers and decreased other co-inhibitory molecules on the treatment groups compared to control groups. This study points out the functional difference of co-inhibitory molecules in sepsis, also sheds the light on a novel immunotherapy in pre-existing malignancy septic patients.

BIOGRAPHY

Mr. Ching-Wen Chen completed his bachelor's degree in Biology and Master's degree in Immunology at National Taiwan University. Currently, Mr. Chen is a Ph.D. candidate in Immunology program at Emory University. He has dedicated himself into translational science area, focusing on the basic science side of human diseases and working with clinical doctors to develop new immunotherapies. His research in Ph.D. dissertation focuses on T cell dysfunctions in sepsis. He published one cutting-edge paper on the *Journal of Immunology* and contributed for one U.S. patent for novel sepsis immunotherapies.

Effects of Sub-Chronic Exposure to Traffic-Related Air Pollution on Central Nervous System Toxicity in Healthy Rats

ABSTRACT

Long-term exposure to traffic-related air pollution (TRAP) has been associated with chronic cardiopulmonary diseases; however, the effect of air pollution on central nervous system (CNS) remains unclear. The objective of this study is to investigate the roles of air pollution on CNS toxicity. An experimental station nearby traffic emission sources in New Taipei City (Taiwan) was established, equipped with ultrafine particle counter, aerosol monitor, nanoparticle aerosol monitor and black carbon monitor for particle monitoring.



Six-month-old SD rats (HEPA and PM1.0) were housed in two exposure chamber systems in the station for whole-body exposure. After three months and six months exposure, rotarod performance test and novel object recognition (NOR) were performed. The daily average of particle number concentration (PNC) was 11478.45 cm-3 with 58.25 nm in electric mobility diameter. The PM1.0 mass concentration, BC and surface area concentration in alveolar region was 15.06 µg/ m3, 1.855 µg/m3 and 54.63 µm2/cm3, respectively. The results showed that exposure to ambient air with and without a filter for three months and six months caused body weight loss compared to control group (P<0.0001). There was no significant difference in rotarod performance test and NOR test among control group, HEPA group or PM1.0 group. In three months exposure, PM1.0 had decreased IL-6 and increased 8iso in hippocampus region compared to control group and HEPA group (P=0.0003, P<0.0001), while there was no significant difference in other brain regions or in the lung, and there was no difference among the six months exposure groups. In conclusion, sub-chronic exposure to TRAP leads to weight loss and may potentially cause brain inflammation in hippocampus region, affecting short-term memory. Further works will focus on the EEG analysis, brain MRI image, pulmonary function test, and pathologic examination.

BIOGRAPHY

Mr. Chi-Hsiang Eddy Shih completed his bachelor's degree at Taipei Medical University. He is currently enrolled in the dual master program of respiratory therapy at Taipei Medical University and Georgia State University. His study is focused on the health impact of air pollution.

Why Are CD8 T Cell Epitopes of Human Influenza Virus Conserved?

Zheng-Rong Tiger Li 李崢嶸, Ph.D. Candidate

ABSTRACT

The CD8 T cell epitopes of human influenza A virus are more conserved than the antibody epitopes. This conservativeness may be explained by (1) mutations on CD8 T cell epitopes are constrained by their potential of decreasing viral fitness; (2) CD8 T cell-escaping mutants barely have advantage because CD8 T cells impose little selection pressure; and (3) the selective advantage of an escaping mutant is limited by the breadth of human major histocompati-



bility complex (MHC) polymorphism at population level. To explore the interplay of these aspects, we constructed a population genetics model incorporating fitness cost, selective advantage, and MHC allele frequency. This model predicts that an escaping mutant either cannot invade or invades at an extremely slow rate under most of the parameter combinations. To account for shifting immunity and genetic drift, we used an ordinary differential equation (ODE) model with stochastic simulation using Gillespie's tau-leaping algorithm to analyze the time required for the emergence and fixation of an invasive CD8 T cell-escaping mutant. We concluded that the small advantage of escaping mutations and human MHC polymorphism can impede the invasion even if no fitness cost is accompanied. This study may serve as a foundation of future modeling works on how a T cell-inducing influenza vaccine drives viral evolution.

BIOGRAPHY

Mr. Zheng-Rong Tiger Li completed his B.S. in life science (2009) and M.S. in epidemiology (2012) at National Taiwan University. Then he worked as a research associate at Institute of Statistical Science, Academia Sinica, Taipei, Taiwan (2013-2015). Mr. Li is currently a Ph.D. Candidate in Immunology and Molecular Pathogenesis at Emory University (2015–). He has co-authored with research papers published in *Scientific Reports, The Journal of Clinical Endocrinology and Metabolism*, and *PLoS One*. The main research interests of Mr. Li are the evolution of influenza virus and the development of T cell-inducing vaccines.

ABSTRACT

After decades of research, we now find ourselves at a time in which mindful meditation has become decidedly mainstream. Scientists have now discovered that a regular meditation practice re-wires the brain, actually helps us to focus, and reduces reactivity. As a result, meditators are more capable of coping with stress.



The speaker will focus on effects of meditation on our brain and how the practice has been beneficial in terms of maintaining a better sense of balance between work and life.

Ways of introducing mindfulness into the classroom to benefit both the students and their instructors will also be discussed.

BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Qi Zhou received her Ph.D. in Psychology, specialized in School Psychology. During her internship in Jefferson Parish public school system, LA, while working with students with emotional disorders, she took an interest in the field of emotional intelligence. Dr. Zhou went on to teach psychology courses at college level, and she expanded her interest into positive psychology – a scientific study of happiness and human strength. During her study of positive psychology, Dr. Zhou discovered meditation and has been practicing it on a daily basis for years. She proposed that meditation, as a way to improve emotional wellbeing and overall happiness, should be a mental habit that everyone needs to build and practice.

As a mother of two, Dr. Zhou's another area of interest is parenting. Dr. Zhou believes that parenting should cultivate good physical, mental, moral, and spiritual habits in the child, nurture the child's emotional wellbeing, and grow the child's emotional intelligence.

別(偽和現實) — 現代主義, 現在, 尚未, 將來的主義 Bie (Pseudo and Real) — Modernism, the Now, the Not Yet and Will Be of *Zhuyi*

Keaton Wynn, M.F.A.

Professor, Department of Fine Arts Georgia Southwestern State University

ABSTRACT

In this paper I will respond to some of the major concepts proposed by Professor Wang Jianjiang applying them to the work of the contemporary artist Cao Fei. While the proactive call for a fresh and transformative progressive modernism within Chinese culture is admirable, I will also question some of the assumptions he has made about Western modernism and modernization. The critical self-examination in Western thought over the past 50 years questioning modernist assumptions for their unfulfilled claims can't be overlooked.



The Postmodern critique which now forms its own tradition must inform any assumptions we make about what is "truly modern." What pressures might derail the form of "modern" Professor Wang hopes to promote in art and culture? I will also discuss the "now" and the "not yet" quality of the *Bie*-modern, the "what is" and what we hope "will be" as the "Pseudo" modern becomes "Real." Professor Wang has called this transition *Bie*-modernism. Through Herbert Marcuse's treatment of the "Aesthetic Dimension" and his claim that radical change is "rooted in the subjectivity of individuals themselves" we can see in Cao Fei's engagement with the immeasurable inner self as the desire to move from the "*Bie*" (Pseudo) modern to the "*Bie*" (Real) modern.^[1]

Keaton Wynn, originally from St. Louis, Missouri, teaches Ceramics and Art History at Georgia Southwestern State University in Americus, Georgia. Wynn earned his B.F.A. in Ceramics at Missouri State University an M.F.A in Ceramics at Kent State University and M.A. in Art History at Virginia Commonwealth University. He is a practicing artist exhibiting widely in regional, national and international exhibitions. ABSTRACT

Despite the health benefits of physical activity and the risks of physical inactivity, many older adults do not accumulate sufficient levels of physical activity to achieve the associated health benefits. Can you imagine what it would look, sound, and feel like if more elders in your community were actually eager to exercise?
