2018 美東南區中華學人協會 第四十二屆年會暨國際研討會報告 「大腦科學與兒童、跨世代教養、和健康老齡化」

美國東南區中華學人協會 (CAPASUS - The Chinese-American Academic and Professional Association in Southeastern United States) 第四十二屆年會暨國際研討會於 2018 年 8 月 3 至 5 日在美國亞特蘭大 Sonesta Gwinnett Place 舉行。為期三天的研討會順利圓滿成功,許多美國東南區各領域的專家學者齊聚一堂,一同為交流知識、提供經驗、及促進台美合作做出貢獻。這次第四十二屆年會暨國際研討會的主題為「大腦科學與兒童,跨世代教養,與健康老齡化」。 會議內容以下面的三大主軸為中心:(1)大腦科學與兒童學習與防老健康老齡化,(2)跨世代教養觀,(3)身與心的平衡。

八月三號(星期五)

開幕演<u>講</u>

今年年會的開幕演講者是紐約州雪城大學(Syracuse University)的 榮譽教授 Dr. Honig,她的主題是「幫助孩子蓬勃發長:一個兒童發展 研究和中國文化的視角」。在這場精彩又激勵人心的演說裡,Honig 博士提醒所有與會者,要重視父母親職責的五個基本要素,要使用開 放式的問題來引導孩子,要有智慧地選擇懲戒的方式。她鼓勵所有的 父母都能找出最適合自己家庭的相處及教育模式,發展出一個堅定、 但同時有有慈愛的教養方式。畢竟,每一個孩子都是獨一無二的,唯 有透過認識才能找出最有效的教養孩子的方法。

主題一:大腦科學和兒童

在第一個主題裡,有兩位貴賓發表演說。第一位是台灣清華大學的柯華葳教授,她的題目是「從眼球移動研究的觀點來看中文閱讀」。柯博士向與會大眾介紹如何經由對眼球移動的錄影觀察來研究探討閱讀理解能力。研究結果顯示:讀者在閱讀敘事性的文章和論述性的文章時,眼球在文字上提留的時間不一樣。論述性的文章一般需要花更長的時間來理解。同樣地,內容性的文字也比功能性的文字需要花更多時間。藉由這樣的研究,研究人員及家長能更加知道如何提昇孩童閱讀理解的能力。第二位是 Gordon State University 的周頎博士和Columbus State University 的方厚彬博士。他們的題目是「上下左右:全腦教養小孩」。兩位講者首先介紹大腦內不同的區塊分別處理負責各種不同的功能。所以家長和教育人員在處理孩童教育問題時,應注意兩種不同的整合:「水平式的整合」:先解決右腦的情緒/感情問題,再處理左腦的邏輯/糾正問題。「垂直式的整合」:整合腦上半部的活動和腦下半部的反應。當家長和教育人員知道腦內的運作和學習的關係後,將能更有效率、更正確地教養孩童。

在兩場精彩的演說之後,所有的與會來賓皆報以熱烈的掌聲。之後,所有的演講者一起合影,大會並致贈證書感謝他們的付出。



主題二:健康老齡化

第二個主題的演講者包括了國立陽明大學的吳肖琪博士、Georgia State University 的 Dr. Elisabeth Burgess 及陳美蘭博士。吳肖琪博士 的題目是「台灣的長期照護」。由於台灣正逐步邁入老齡化的社會, 如何建立起可長久施行的長照制度,是刻不容緩的事情。吳博士從台 灣一開始的十年長照計畫、到後來的長照施行條款、介紹到最新的長 照 2.0 版的計畫,在在顯示政府非常關心長期照護的政策,也一直在 增加長照裡所涵蓋的項目。Burgess 博士則是比較了喬治亞州六個照 顧居住中心,研究這些需要照料的老人,如何滿足他們在親密關係上 的需求。她發現老人還是有相當程度親密關係的需求,但是在這些照 顧居住中心裡並無法滿足這樣的需求,因為隱私空間不足。Burgess 的研究可以讓政府在規劃照顧居住中心及老人生活時有更多的思考。 第三位演講者陳美蘭博士則是說明在人們老化的過程中,如何維持腦 部的健康狀況,以避免阿茲海默症狀的發生,包括了定期規律的運 動、多吃抗氧化的食物、更佳的睡眠、以及多作能刺激認知的活動。 陳博士提醒每一位與會者:如果不常使用大腦,功能將逐漸喪失。 最後,同樣的,所有的演講者一起合影,大會也頒贈證書感謝他們。

Track 2: Healthy Aging Presenters

主題三:跨世代的教養

在第三主題中,發表研究的有 Georgia State University 的 Susan Kelley 教授、Georgia Southwestern State University 的 Ellen Cotter 教授、及 Albert Einstein College of Medicine 的 Teresa Hsu Walklet 教授。Susan Kelley 教授的題目是「祖父母撫養的孩子:全球 視野」,她認為基於各種因素,包括兒童虐待、負面的兒時經驗以及 勞工移民,許多孩童由祖父母扶養。然而,被祖父母扶養的兒童以及 祖父母本身在健康與社交上所面臨的風險卻大為提升。演講者闡述了 祖父母扶養祖孫時所會面臨的挑戰,並且提供方法以提升祖父母扶養 孩子家庭之成效。Ellen Cotter 教授的題目是「提昇青少年的心理健康 和人際關係」,她藉由探討責少年各方面的心理健康與社交功能,以 提供與青少年接觸的家長及專家實用性的建議,希望藉此達成幫助彼 此間成功互動的目標。演講內容包括了大腦發展、大腦如何與情緒反 應連結、憂鬱症之徵兆、社交媒體對青少年心理健康與自尊的影響、 以其如何減少與青少年發生衝突之策略。最後, Hsu-Walket 教授的題 目是「雙文化家庭中的教養觀」,她認為我們正面臨著巨大的文化隔 閡或是缺乏對於不同文化與世代的理解,此隔閡尤其是在教養第一代 與第二代孩子方式上的不同。演講者介紹了不同的教養方式,並且探 討其對兒童發展與行為之影響。同時,演講者也解釋"基因"與"環 境"如何交錯影響兒童發展。最後,同樣的,所有的演講者一起合 影,大會也頒贈證書感謝他們。

主題四:跨文化教養觀

在這個場次裡,有兩位教授發表他們的研究,分別是 Georgia Parent Infant Network for Educational Services 的魏鳳珠博士及 Georgia Southwestern State University 的周小迪博士。魏博士認為由於東西方的文化差異,第二代移民家庭中的孩子普遍面臨了挑戰與衝突。演講者使用不同的實際例子與情境來比較該兩種差異極大文化之特徵,以與聽眾之個人生活經驗作連結。增加對此議題的理解能夠有助於提升移民家庭中父母與孩子之社交與身心的福祉。周博士也分享他的經驗,身為一名美籍華裔,他闡述了他找尋個人與文化認同的經驗與旅程。他分享了他如何從一個自認為是白人、渴望成為白人、以及以身為中國後裔而感到羞恥之人轉變為一位現在能夠更加認同與親近自己

傳統的人。最後,同樣的,所有的演講者一起合影,大會也頒贈證書 感謝他們。

中華學人協會會員大會



開幕致詞

吳珠菊會長在最後一天的年會上致詞,再次歡迎所有的與會的會員並簡短介紹精彩的演講內容,邀請大家參與到最後的大笑瑜珈。隨後, 駐休士頓台北經濟文化辦事處科技組游慧光組長介紹了台灣科技部目前的發展重點及人才培育計畫並鼓勵年輕學子回國服務帶動台灣經濟發展。游組長表示台灣雖然土地及人口在世界上並不起眼,但整體的 經濟競爭實力及國民生產毛額皆在世界上排名前半段,許多世界知名品牌亦皆來自台灣。之後,台灣將繼續致力於創新及科技的發展,目前重點項目包括了 The Einstein Program, The LIFT Program,還有The LEAP Program。

傑出青年組主題的主持人陳美蘭博士

主題五:傑出青年組發表

第五個主題是由傑出青年學者發表他們目前的研究成果。一開始,主 持人陳美蘭博士先簡單介紹這次評選摘要的過程及標準。此次共有三 位在學的青年學者發表,分別是 Emory University 的陳鏡文先生, Georgia State University 的時繼驤先生,及 Emory University 的李 崢嶸先生。陳鏡文先生發表的研究指出敗血症目前是醫院裡致死率第 一名的病症,而目前並無有效的藥物控制。在他的實驗裡,他們發現 封鎖 T 細胞上的共同抑制分子能有效的增加動物在敗血症上的存活 率。作者也指出,這個新的治療方式可以用在得癌症的動物身上,增 加他們在敗血症上的存活率。研究的結果指出,在治療敗血症上的關 鍵應該就是在 T 細胞上。第二位報告者,時繼驤先生,則是研究交通 所造成的空氣污染對健康老鼠的中樞神經系統的影響。他們讓老鼠全 身都接觸污染的空氣,在經過三個月和六個月的曝曬之後,分析老鼠 的行為模式並採取腦中的細胞來分析。研究顯示,長期曝曬在交通所 造成的空氣污染會造成老鼠體重減輕,也會造成小腦區域的腦部發 炎。第三位報告者,李崢嶸先生,則表示流行性感冒是目前一個很大 的隱憂,他的研究顯示專門對付 T 細胞的流感疫苗比目前的流感疫苗 更加有效。他表示這樣的成果之後也許可以用在其他病毒引起的症狀 上。

所有的與會成員皆對三位青年學者的研究成果、學識、及沉著穩定的 態度表示嘉許,相信三位青年才俊之後必能在各自的領域上有傑出的 表現,大放光彩。

小組座談:永久職申請準備

在這場小組座談裡,學人協會邀請了 Georgia Institute of Technology 的梁越昇博士、University of Georgia 的洪延康博士、University of North Georgia 的林彥君博士來對年輕學者分享在美永久職申請的準備注意事項。座談採用問答的方式。三位教授們表示即

使各個單位有其申請終身職的的規則,「發表論文」必為一重要的指標。梁教授進一步解釋,如果能在發表過的論文中建立一套學問的系統,串連前後的因果關係,將更加展現申請者對其專業領域的影響。林教授自「教學」的觀點出發,分享她如何以設立教學計畫和教學的經驗作為終身職申請的主軸,佐以學生的回饋和評鑑。最後,洪教授提醒,由政府或企業資助的研究型計畫在申請上是一大加分,年輕學者不妨多多著力於此。

在這個座談結束之後,駐亞特蘭大台北經濟文化辦事處戴素琳組長、 亞特蘭大華僑文教服務中心傅瑾玲主任和現場的來賓介紹目前台灣政 府對海外青年回國就業的資源與管道,鼓勵年輕學者回國貢獻所長。

主題六:身與心的平衡

這個主題是今年年會的最後一個場次,重點在於如何達到身心靈的平衡,一共有三位講者發表演講,分別是 Gordon State University 的問傾博士、Georgia Southwestern State University 的 Keaton Wynn 教授,及 Laughter Yoga Atlanta 的負責人 Greene 女士。在第一場演講裡,周博士表示壓力是日常的事件,可以發生在我們所做的任何事情上。這是一個我們可以通過有意識的評估來識別的一種內在過程。冥想是通過這種評估方式,反思評估結果,並檢查這些壓力過程如何影響我們身心的一種修習訓練。由於這種修習訓練可以在生理上改變我

們大腦中的化學平衡,因此改變我們對壓力的態度和採取的反應,從 而可以改善我們的生活質量。在第二場演講裡·Wynn 教授 介紹討論 的是王建江教授提出的關於中國當代藝術家曹斐作品的主要概念。王 教授對新鮮和變革性的進步現代主義的積極呼喚令人欽佩,但王教授 關於西方現代主義和現代化的假設卻是值得商榷的。通過赫伯特馬爾 庫塞對"美學維度"的看法以及他認為激進變革其實"植根於個人自 身的主體性"的說法,我們可以說曹斐她與無限寬廣的內在自我的交 錯互動,是能推動偽性的"別"現代轉移為真實的"別"現代的一種 巧妙機制。

最後在 Greene 女士的帶領下,全體會員一同進行「一路笑到健康」的 大笑瑜珈活動。儘管身體活動對健康有益,而不活動身體會有很多風 險, 老年人的身體活動多半不足以保健身體。如果你想為老年人提供 功能性健身的樂趣,並在鍛煉課程中獲得持久的參與,那麼笑是關鍵。 LaughActive 是一種結合好玩有趣的笑聲訓練,中等難度,能強化力 量、平衡、耐力和靈活性的課程, Greene 主任帶領所有與會會員,做 了一系列的 LaughAcitve 練習,展示了 LaughActive 實踐的功效和樂 趣。全場笑聲不斷,許多會員都笑到停不下來,久久不能自己。大家 都表示,感覺身體更健康了。


Opening Address

Dr. Alice Sterling Honig from Syracuse University gave an opening address entitled "Parenting: A Fantastic Life-Affirming, Tough Job". In her interesting and stimulating speech, Dr. Honig reminded the parents that they should be aware of the five fundamental goals for ensuring flourish. Parents young children needed to knowledgeable about child ages and stages, to use Socratic/openended guestion for children, and to choose disciplines wisely. Dr. Honig also encouraged the parents to figure out individual child's temperament styles, and to choose a firm, yet loving parenting style because, as she pointed out, each child is unique. Dr. Alice Honig's speech was very charming and inspiring to the audience. Her speech kicked off our conference successfully.

Track 1: Neuroscience and Kids

There are two thought-provoking presentations in this track. In the first talk, Dr. Hwawei Ko from National Tsing Hua University gave a speech entitled "Reading Chinese: a view from eye movement studies". In her talk, Dr. Ko introduced to the audience how to use video-based eye tracker to investigate reading comprehension. She showed that readers exhibit a difference between expositive texts and narrative texts, and between functional words and content words. It takes longer for readers to process expositive texts and content words. Based on these findings, parents and researchers will be able to investigate further how to improve children's reading ability. In the second talk, Dr. Zhou and Dr. Fang gave their speech "Top and Bottom, Right and Left: Raising the Whole Brain Child". In that speech, the presenters introduced how different parts of the brain dealt with different functions. Parents and educators should try to incorporate two things: horizontal integration (deal with right brain emotions first before left brain logic and corrections) and vertical integration (use top brain's actions to work with bottom brain's reactions). All the audiences, especially those with children, all benefit tremendously from these two talks.

Track 2: Healthy Aging

Three special speakers gave their interesting researches and findings in the second track: healthy aging. Dr. Shiao-Chi Wu from National Yang Ming University introduced the Long Term Care (LTC) plan and program in Taiwan. As Taiwan is developing into an aging society, the establishment of prevention and healthy city is essential. After the LTC 10-year program and the LTC services Act, the government is now building the LTC ver. 2.0 to build a 3A community-based LTC and to increase the covered items in LTC. The second speaker, Dr. Elisabeth Burguess from Georgia State University, is an expert in Gerontology, and GSU also has the largest and the most comprehensive Gerontology program in Georgia. In her talk, Dr. Burguess investigated how intimacy was negotiated in assisted living, and found out that aging citizens also have the need for intimate relationship. She also discussed some of the barriers (such as the lack of private space) and potential strategies and justifications we can do to improve this. The third speaker, Dr. Mei-Lan Chen, Assistant Professor from Georgia State University, talked about how to maintain a healthy brain as we got older to prevent Alzheimer's Dementia. The tips included regular exercise, antioxidant fruits, better sleeps, and cognitive stimulating activities, and etc. Dr. Chen reminded us that we have to use the brain or we'll eventually lose it. A certificate was given to each presenter and a group photo was taken at the end.

Track 3: Intergenerational Parenting: Aspirations

In Track 3, again, three distinguished speakers from their fields gave their knowledgeable and informative talks. The first speaker, Dr. Susan Kelley from Georgia State University, showed that children were raised by grandparents because of a variety of reasons, including child maltreatment and adverse childhood experiences, as well as labor migration. However, children being raised by grandparents and grandparent caregivers were at increased risk for negative health and social outcomes. The speaker addressed the challenges grandparents raising grandchildren and provided strategies for improving the outcomes for grandparent-headed families. In the second speech, Dr. Ellen Cotter, from Georgia Southwestern State University, explored several aspects of mental health and social functioning in teenagers, with a goal of giving parents and professional who worked with teenagers some practical suggestions for successful interactions. Topics included brain development and its ties to emotional reactions, signs of depression, the effects of social media on teenagers' mental health and self-esteem, and strategies for minimizing conflict with teenagers. In the third speech, Dr. Teresa Hsu-Walklet from Albert Einstein College of Medicine, explained that we are currently experiencing a huge cultural gap or the lack of cultural understanding of different cultures and generations. The gap is particularly relevant to disagreements about parenting first- and second-generation children. The speaker addressed different types of parenting styles and discussed how it affects child behavior and development. She also explained how "nature" and "nurture" intertwined to impact child development. A certificate is given to each presenter and a group photo is taken at the end.

Track 4: Cross Cultural Parenting Perspectives

In track 4, two speakers shared their experiences in how to deal with cross-cultural conflicts and negotiation. The first speaker, Dr. Alice Stanley from Georgia Parent Infant Network for Educational Services, told the audience that, due to the differences between Western and Eastern culture, the second generation of children from immigrant families often faced challenges and conflicts. The speaker compared the characteristics of two very different cultures by giving specific scenarios and examples to connect to the audiences' personal experiences. Increasing our understanding of the issue can benefit the social and mental well-being of immigrant parents and children. The second speaker, Dr. Xiaodi Zhou from Georgia Southwestern State University, shared his personal experience and journey of searching for his own personal and cultural identity. He shared how he was transmitted from seeing him as White, yearning to be White, and feeling shame towards his Chinese ancestry to a person who are now identifying more closely with his heritage. The audiences are very active in the Q&A session with lots of interesting comments and questions. A certificate was given to each presenter and a group photo was taken at the end.



Opening Remarks

President Wu of CAPASUS gave an opening remark and welcomed every member to the final day of the annual meeting. After that, Director Tiffany Yu from TECO-Houston gave an introduction about the work and mission of MOST (Ministry of Science and Technology) in Taiwan. She mentioned that while Taiwan was small in land size and population, it ranked 22nd worldwide in GDP and 14th in its competitiveness, and many well-known brands all originated from Taiwan, including TSMC, Foxconn, Giant, and etc. As a result, Taiwan

will continue to dedicate itself to the research of AI innovation. Future endeavor to connect the world include: the Einstein Program, The LIFT Program, and the LEAP Program. As an encouragement for talented and outstanding foreign professionals to work in Taiwan, the government is also providing friendly and expedited visa measures.

Track 5: Early Career Caucus

Moderator Mei-Lan Chen briefly talked about the selecting process for the early career caucus presentation. The three selected student presenters were Mr. Ching-Wen Chen, Chi-Hsiang Shih, and Tiger Li. The first presenter, Mr, Ching-Wen Chen talked about Sepsis was the leading cause of death in hospital and there were no approved drugs available for sepsis patients. In this sepsis animal study, the author demonstrated that blockade of co-inhibitory molecules on T cells significantly improves the sepsis survival in animal. Moreover, the author also assessed the efficacy of this novel therapy on cancer bearing animals and showed it also improves the sepsis survival in cancer animals. This research showed that T cells are the potential therapeutic targets during sepsis.

The second presenter, Mr. Chi-Hsiang Shih explained that in order to investigate the effects of traffic-related air pollution (TRAP) on central nervous system in healthy rats, the researchers established the whole-body exposure station near traffic emission source. After three months and six months exposure, the researcher conducted the behavior tests and collected the brain tissues for further analyses. The results indicated that sub-chronic exposure to TRAP led to weight loss and caused brain inflammation in hippocampus region in the experimental group.

The third presenter, Mr. Tiger Li explained that Influenza is an important public health concern, and T cell-inducing influenza vaccine has been proposed to improve the effectiveness of the current vaccine. The researcher combined a mathematical model and mouse experiment to demonstrate the conservation of T-cell epitopes may be due to the small selective advantage of escape-variant and MHC polymorphism. Based on this study, we aim to explore an essential question for the vaccine: Does a T cell-inducing vaccine also drive virus evolution, which reduces the vaccine effectiveness?

Panel Discussion: Tenure Application Preparation

In this session, we invited Dr. Steven Liang (Georgia Institute of Technology), Dr. Yen-Con Hung (University of Georgia), and Dr. Emily Lin (University of North Georgia) to talk about tenure applications in research (Drs. Liang and Hung) and teaching tracks (Dr. Lin). The session is conducted in a Q&A format. Although each school / research institute has its own rules for tenure, a rule of thumb is the publications. Beyond the quantity of research papers, Dr. Liang pointed out it is essential to build up a system, through which the applicant can show his/her impact on the specific field. From the perspective of teaching track, Dr. Lin mentioned the teaching plan and experience are the major points to work on. Students' feedback and evaluation can serve as important backups. Finally, Dr. Hung reminded us, having funding is a big bonus, as it underpins the applicant's competency in his/her field as well as the ability of running independent and novel studies.

After the discussion on tenure application preparation, Director Tai and Director Fu from TECO-Atlanta also gave a brief introduction on Taiwan job resources for overseas youth.

Track 6: Art and Life; Body and Mind

In the last session of 2018 CAPASUS annual meeting, three invited speakers showed the audience how to achieve a balanced life. The first speaker, Dr. Qi Zhou told us that stressors are every-day events and can happen with anything we do. It is a process we can identify by a conscious step call appraisal. Meditation is a practice that helps us go through the stress process by conducting appraisals, reflect on the appraisal results, and examine how the process of stress affect us. Quality of life then can be improved by the responses we choose based on calm and deep reflection which can physically modified the chemical balance in our brain. The second speaker, Professor Keaton Wynn introduced his idea of Bie (別)-modernism. An examination of the major concepts proposed by Prof. Wang, Jianjiang over the work of Chinese contemporary artist Cao Fei was presented. The proactive call for a fresh and transformative progressive modernism can be admirable, yet the assumptions Prof. Wang had regarding Western modernism and modernization are debatable. Through Herbert Marcuse's treatment of the "Aesthetic Dimension" and his claim that radical change is "rooted in the subjectivity of the individuals themselves" we can see in Cao Fei's engagement with the

immeasurable inner self as the design to move from the "Bie" (Pseudo) modern to the "Bie" (Real) Modern. The third speaker, Director Celeste Greene of Laughter Yoga Atlanta, led the audience in discovering how to maintain a healthy body through laughter and physical activities. Despite the health benefits of physical activity and the risks of physical inactivity, many older adults did not accumulate sufficient levels of physical activity to achieve the associated health benefit. If you want to put the fun in functional fitness for older adults and unlock lasting engagement in exercise programing, laughter is the key. LaughActive is a moderate-intensity strength, balance, endurance, and flexibility program that incorporates playful laughter exercises. Director Greene led a series of LaughAcitve activities. There was laughter everywhere and all the members were happily engaged.
